Director of Finance and Budget, NYSTEC

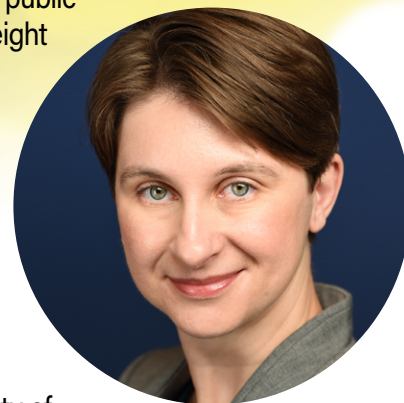
Jasminka Husic serves as Director of Finance and Budget at New York State Technology Enterprise Corporation (NYSTEC). A certified public accountant, she has eight
